Both shy but interested, they exchanged contact information and for the next year and a half, wrote emails and Skyped across continents, building trust and a love for one another.

It was in January of 2012 that they decided to come to their parents with their request to wed. While they were both quick to admit they are not traditional village people, they still wanted to respect the marriage process of their tribes and move forward with the appropriate rituals, though their transcontinental courtship had been anything but traditional.



or foreseen. The helical pier foundation was not successfully installed in the first phase because of issues with our installation tool. We plan on addressing this with the manufacturing company and utilizing the piers for the flooring system. We relied on our Plan B for the foundation and hand dug 46 holes for a concrete steel combination footing.

We have also encountered problems with our South Sudanese contractor (GDC) and their internal operations. The site manager from GDC assigned to our project has not been communicating with the company due to issues not related to our project. For this reason, assembling the building structure has been delayed. We are hopeful

GDC will finish their staffing arrangements and work can move forward. Please feel free to join us in prayer as many of our current project obstacles are beyond our control.

Currently, we need an estimated \$15,000 to wrap up Phase 1 which includes paying the final amount to the contractor, payment to the onsite security guards, and some outstanding expenses.
